Saturday August 4th M4G & Inspire Event***Visit to Ironbridge including 'Industrial Revolution' tour.***

The Industrial Revolution has led to the biggest change in human lifestyle since the invention of farming thousands of years ago. It began in Shropshire in 1709 with a new process for producing iron on a larger scale than before, and this was soon combined with the steam engine to produce power on large scales - first to power machine tools in factories, then in transport with engines that powered ships and trains. It could only begin where several factors came together, and Ironbridge and Coalbrookdale had them all.
